

A **prefix** is a group of letters **added** to the beginning of a **word** to **change its meaning**.

▶ A **prefix** has a similar **meaning** in all words.

Prefix and Word	Prefix Meaning	Meaning of Word	Sentence

rebuild		build again	We had to rebuild our house.
