Beginning	Characters & Setting	<p><b>A long time ago, in a jail tower on the island of Crete, Icarus</b> waited for the day he would be set free. Icarus was the son of a master craftsman named <b>Daedalus</b>.</p> <p><b>Icarus</b> was <b>mistaken for a thief and put in the jail tower</b>. He knew his father would be disappointed in him. Desperate to get out, he used bird feathers and wax to <b>create wings. With the little magic he kept in his pocket watch, he was able to cast a spell. He flew out of the tower!</b> He was on his way to see his father and find the real thief.</p>
