**Tone** is the poet's **attitude** toward a topic and/or readers.

- ▶ Tone can be playful, angry, disgusted, serious, happy, etc.
- ▶ Tone can often be conveyed by the Elements of Poetry.

## **Elements of Poetry**

### rhyme

Words that have the same ending sound.

### repetition

To say something over and over.

### word choice

Words that are used for an exact meaning or emotions.
