

To **print** means to write words and sentences.

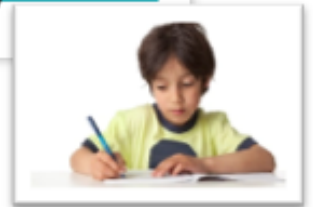
▶ To print **legibly** means to write **neatly**.
