

**Inflectional forms** are letters **added to the end of a word**.

► There are **three inflectional forms**: **-s**, **-ed**, **-ing**.

Inflectional Form	Word	Word with Inflectional Form	Example Sentence
-s	play	plays	He <b>plays</b> soccer.
-ed	play	played	She <b>played</b> with Tom.
-ing	play	playing	I am <b>playing</b> outside.

has, red, sing
